Thoughts from Pastor Paul

Dear Siblings in Christ,

A big thank you for all your prayers and well wishes as I continue to recover from my hospitalization in November and December. Each day I feel a little more strength returning. A big thank you too for all of you who were able help my family and me move into our new home. Hazel, Elizabeth and I are so looking forward to getting settled and having you all over for a thank you celebration. We'll keep you posted.

Well, we've made it to 2024. It is my hope and prayer that all of God's creation will find and know peace in God's agape love that is meant for all of God's creation and that all will share that love as God calls us to.

As we celebrate each New Year with hope for the future, and starting anew, I hope and pray that you will consider, with God's help, taking on a New Year's resolution, and of course, the resolution that I encourage you to take on, if you're not already doing so, is that of finding a spiritual discipline. 
Our Session Has a New Look!

"We have different gifts, according to the grace given to each of us. If your gift is prophesying, then prophesy in accordance with your faith; if it is serving, then serve; if it is teaching, then teach; if it is to encourage, then give encouragement; if it is giving, then give generously; if it is to lead, do it diligently; if it is to show mercy, do it cheerfully." (Romans 12:6-8, NIV)

Following the guidance of the Holy Spirit, your FPC Astoria Session recently voted to establish teams to spread out the work and responsibilities of our church family. If you feel called to be a part of any of these teams, please let one of your Session members or Pastor Paul know. The new teams are:

- Buildings & Grounds
 - Repairs and maintenance of church buildings.
 - Correspondence and coordination with organizations leasing space from FPC Astoria including the annual review and signing of corresponding leases.
 - Manage and coordinate rentals of church space for special events.
- Christian Education
 - Determine needs for Christian education for all ages of the church family and seek ways to meet those needs.
 - o Coordinate with recruiting teachers and facilitators for different studies.
- Fellowship & Outreach
 - Coordinate activities that promote fellowship and outreach that help to strengthen the relationships between church family members and members of the surrounding community.
- Mission
 - Identify mission needs both locally and globally that the church family can contribute to either financially or physically.
 - o Coordinate efforts to gather support for mission activities with
 - "Moments for Mission"
 - Gathering or creating announcements and inserts seeking assistance from the church family in answering the needs of the given mission.
- Finance & Stewardship
 - Attend to and maintain all FPC Astoria's financial bookkeeping requirements in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles and related laws.
 - o Send out letters with giving amounts to those who have contributed to the church family's finances.
 - o Create and implement annual stewardship campaigns.
- Worship
 - Continually review weekly worship and recommend changes based on comments from the congregation or from personal experiences.
 - o Identify and help plan special worship opportunities throughout the liturgical year.
 - When needed, assist in filling the pulpit through obtaining pulpit supply.
- Personnel
 - Meet with the employees of FPC Astoria on a regular basis.
 - Ascertain the needs of the employees.
 - Give employee reviews at least annually.
- Nominating
 - Seek candidates for open Ruling Elder and Deacon seats.

Are we a rowboat church or a sailboat church?

Next Class January 7 – Chapter 4

Rowboat churches depend largely on human effort. When church budgets shrink and membership declines, rowboat churches frantically row harder against a current, often frustrated and disappointed at their efforts. Sailboat churches, on the other hand, take up the oars, hoist sails, and rely on the Holy Spirit to guide them.

Arguing that churches should be "sailboats," Joan S. Gray encourages readers to shift concern from the many daily, practical concerns of their local church to fresh ideas that can be found using the guidance of the Holy Spirit. The book includes forty days of sailing prayers, quotes from Scripture, brief reflection questions, and an extensive bibliography that is arranged by theme. Perfect for groups to read together, this book will help leaders reframe their church's mission and practice with the Holy Spirit as their guide.



Educating the church to expand our welcome of LGBTQIA+ people, to affirm their gifts for ordained office, and to uphold marriage equality for all; and




