NOTES FROM BEYOND THE PEWS

Thoughts from Pastor Paul

Dear Siblings in Christ,

Hope and pray this note finds you well and feeling blessed. As the Lenten season comes to a close and as we enter Holy Week, it is my hope too that your Lenten journey has been a fruitful one and that you have been able to find a spiritual discipline to help you strengthen your relationship with the Holy Trinity.

If you've been able to be in worship this Lenten season, you've heard a lot of talk about Simon, or as Jesus liked to call him, Peter. What is so great about Peter is the fact that, although Jesus called him to follow him and eventually lead his disciples, Peter was really good at saying something once without thinking twice. In other words, Peter had a talent for putting his proverbial foot in his mouth. And if you are like me, you can appreciate Peter's talent for doing this. Not because it's something one endeavors to do, but because many of us, me included, share Peter's talent. And here's the good news, if Jesus was able to look beyond Peter's stumbling, he does the same of each of us.

This isn't always something that is easy to remember. There are many times when we hold onto those moments when we stumble, putting our foot in our mouths being one possible stumble, and feel like the whole world is judging us for said stumble, when in reality, we ourselves are the only ones judging us. In Luke 9:62, Jesus reminds us that we must not look to our past but rather forward to God's future, "Jesus said, "No procrastination. No backward looks. You can't put God's kingdom off till tomorrow. Seize the day." (MSG)

Now don't get me wrong, when we find ourselves saying something regretful, we must make amends to try to set things right, but we must not do so on our own; instead, we must seek the help of the Holy Spirit to give us the words and actions necessary to set things right. Then we must seek to move forward on God's path and not let the words or actions of the past keep us in the past. Remember Jesus' words from John 3: 16-18, "This is how much God loved the world: He gave his Son, his one and only Son. And this is why: so that no one need be destroyed; by believing in him, anyone can have a whole and lasting life. God didn't go to all the trouble of sending his Son merely to point an accusing finger, telling the world how bad it was. He came to help, to put the world right again. Anyone who trusts in him is acquitted..." (MSG)

So, siblings in Christ, do you best, with the help of the Holy Trinity, to not stumble, but if you do, remember Peter and that you are in good company. Remember too, with the help of the Holy Trinity, to pick yourself up and not dwell in past mistakes. For when we do that, we miss out on the gift of God's present and future that is laid out before us. As it is written in Isaiah 43:18-19, "Forget about what's happened; don't keep going over old history. Be alert, be present. I'm about to do something brand-new." (MSG)

And by the way, if someone stumbles in front of you like Peter did so often, respond like Jesus taught us, show them God's agape love and help them back up as best you can.

Please be safe and take care of yourselves and be kind to those around you, and that includes yourself. If you'd like to hear from me, please give me or the church office a call and let me know. And don't forget to not just invite someone to church or a church event, bring them! See you at church!

Per Capita Payment

As most of us know, pledging is an important part of helping our session to create a budget every year. To know how much we can afford to spend on church activities and mission work, we must have an estimate of how much money will be coming into the church.

Our Presbytery is no different, except that they have a budget that relies on income that is received not from pledges, but rather on a per capita. The per capita is determined by the number of active members of the congregations divided by the budgeted expenses. For this year, the amount of our per capita is \$45.60. The per capita helps our Presbytery to continue its important work of supplying resources and services to each congregation, including ours, as well as doing other missional work in the Presbytery's region.

We are asking that each member please pay their \$45.60 per capita to the church, so that we can pass it on to the Presbytery of the Cascades without pulling money directly from the church's resources.

Please let the church office or our Finance Team know if you've any questions.





INTERFAITH PRAYER WALK


Good Friday, March 29th, at 3:30 pm

Good Friday Processional: Prayers for the Community Friday, March 29 @ 3:30 P.M.




We meet at 12th and Duane to begin the processional and will end at 11th and Duane at the Garden of the Surging Waves.


